- **Looking for more volunteers!!! Tuesday nights at Gaudenzia Concept 90 on Cameron St, Harrisburg.. 7pm... every Tuesday - open to male and female volunteers - don't go past first step - normally like 30-40 people there → email if interested - aharrisburg.org**
 - would like to get 10-12 people and then have them rotate each week

Accessibilities: Keegan

- there is only going to be 1 interpretive service for Sept and then they are going to put services on about a month or more hold, tbt about how long that will be... our deaf member is out of the area for a long period of time & the other individual that was hard of hearing is also out of town, indefinitely - so at the moment, there is not a known need for an interpreter for people in our area, so in the event that one or more people return or someone new presents, they are going to veer away from the paid services and try and get State funded services set up if we need them again while there is no immediate need, that way we are ready for the next deaf person- some feedback so far: the informal services that have been provided have been challenging for the deaf member as he can get things interpreted to him but he is unable to share themselves - coming up with a new plan while we have this gap in service needs

- made sure rent and everything was up to date and nothing outstanding as far as bills going -- pretty sure only the phone was lingering
- a member of the Mt Holly Springs group wanted to know if there is anything they could have to give to other groups to show them what is available since they are apart of Harrisburg Intergroup now ((as far as Activities lists, etc)) - advised to check out sobriety news on the website because that has all updated activities, events, etc - also advised that the Events Packet (provided at Intergroup meetings) has all updated events

- "Who you contact" volunteer sheets were passed out last meeting - will put in a binder

OLD BUSINESS:

- conversation on accepting outside contributions - handled
- discussed sales tax - will be discussing further in new business

NEW BUSINESS:

- Andy nominated as the Intergroup District liaison - Accepted!
- **Motion to formulate a formal response for when people outreach to Harrisburg Intergroup about making a new meeting and joining and getting it posted so that way they get the info and the steps that they need to take in order to do so → discussion → CARRIES!** - 3 members joining together to make script
- **19th Street** - looking for support from people with tim!! They are a small group with high numbers because it is the only group that the work release center allows the work release people to go to - small core group of people with time that keep things running.. pass out a 10 newcomer chips a week, 120 schedules, pay for signs and everything to keep it going - just asking for other group members to **PLEASE COME AND HELP SPREAD THE MESSAGE!**
- someone asked if we are able to send any Big Books to work with AAWS to get to the Bahamas during their time of need -- asking to bring up next month
- **TAXES:**
 - applied to State for an exemption - need from this group to submit a provision to our BYLAWS -- SEE NOTE ON SALES EXEMPT APP THAT IS STARRED (attachment included in minutes)
 - per our bylaws we have to post to our website for a period of 60 days before it is approved - but we can get it posted and start the process now -- step one
 - **MOTION to make provision to bylaws - CARRIES!**
 - will take 16-18 weeks for Dept of Rev to approve us and give us the certificate (assuming we get approved) → in the meantime, the 6% sales tax will be on all sales until everything is approved -- State will then refund any sales tax (provided we have support & will need to submit a separate report later) but they will not refund anything prior to form being submitted - so important we get the provision up on our website to get things rolling
 - looking at about \$50 a month right now that we are paying out in taxes
 - archives advised that taxes will work out to be what the free shipping - suggest that they absorb the cost until we are able to get our refund instead of charging everyone purchasing literature
 - **MOTION to absorb the cost of the taxes and not pass it along to alcoholics - CARRIES!**

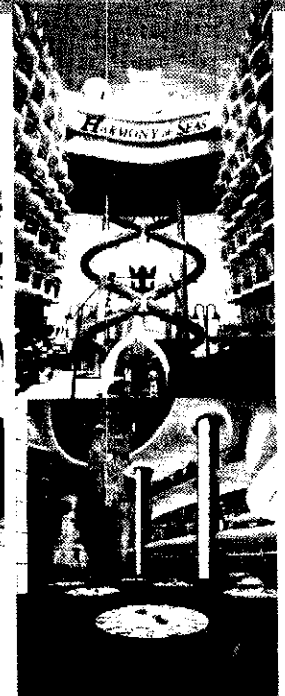
