2 In response to many correctional facilities going paperless, Grapevine and AAWS Publishing collaborated on a multi-year project to make A.A. literature available on more than 200,000 tablets in jails and prisons.

Many prison libraries also can access our growing number of audio books to help those with literacy issues.

The new Corrections Correspondence Service (CCS) database helps us to more quickly match persons in custody with members who are able to write to them. In addition to coordinating thousands of CCS participants, the Corrections Coordinator continues to answer 500 letters each month from members on the inside.









INFLATION ADJUSTED GSO EXPENSE HISTORY



7TH TRADITION SELF-SUPPORT – 2013 – 2022




GROWTH OF ON-LINE CONTRIBUTIONS2013 – 2022






THE GENERAL SERVICE CONFERENCE STRUCTURE U.S. and Canada



Review suggested revisions for the final draft pamphlet "A.A. in Your Community."


The committee recommended that the pamphlet "A.A. in Your Community" be approved with minor editorial changes.


Review progress report on update to the pamphlet "A.A. for the Older Alcoholic— Never too Late."


Additional Committee Considerations

The committee recommended that *The A.A. Service Manual* not be printed in 2023 and that a new edition be published biannually (i.e., every two years), beginning in 2024.






Additional Committee Considerations

Composition of Members




