 - o Nicole P. suggests that we could make a donation *NOT* to exceed \$300. Once the workshop bills are paid after the workshop is completed, and if we have approval from the Home Groups, then we can make the donation.
 - o The donation will come from the Workshop budget line in D36 budget. The donation goes directly to Stepping Stone *not* to James T.

EPGSA Informational Discussion with Paul M.

- This year the cost went up by only 2.5% this year for the hotel registration which does include your meals.
- 2026, 2027 & 2028 the EPGSA will be at the Wyndham. The contract will be done in 2028.
- If EPGSA doesn't contract to include the meals with the hotel registration, it would end up costing AA members approximately \$75-\$100/person.
- The Wyndham does not charge us for the breakout rooms or for the hospitality suites.

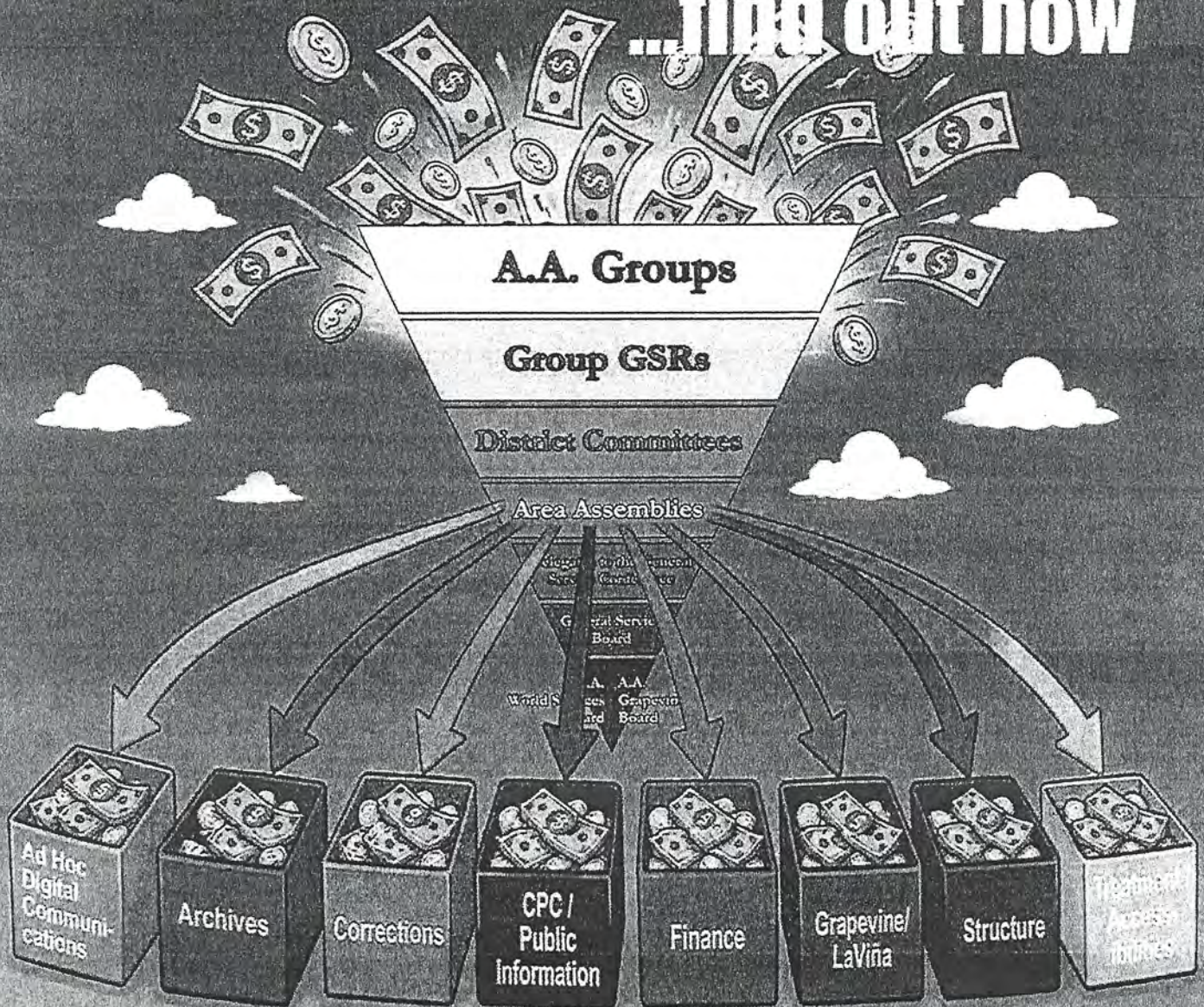

We're excited to announce that the first release of the Everything AA app under the ownership of A.A. World Services is now available. We encourage you to update your app to Version 5.0 to access the latest features.

Over the last several months, the app team at the General Service Office has been working behind the scenes to address critical technical and infrastructure issues and ensure the app is stable, reliable, and ready to support app users. This work is an important step in establishing a strong foundation for the app's future as we review app content and design.

The app is a recent addition to the many services GSO provides to the Fellowship. It remains available for download without cost; however, there is an option to subscribe at \$1.99 a month or \$19.99 a year to support the app's continued development and maintenance. This optional subscription model follows a similar practice to the A.A. Grapevine's subscription model for its app. The AAWS board has engaged in thoughtful discussion and deliberation to ensure that this aligns with our Traditions. Subscribers will receive content, as noted below, and are not contributing to the Seventh Tradition with their subscriptions.

In the next year, as the app team continues to review and develop this important platform, you will notice phased changes to content and features along with the addition of new resources for all app users.

This first release includes a new feature: Bonus content for subscribers only. Subscribers will have access to "Voices of A.A. Today," which is excerpted from the 2025 International Convention commemorative book, **A Book of Fellowship - 90 Years of Sharing Love and Service**, now available for purchase only in print at the online bookstore. In the coming months, other treasures from our publications and archives, including audio and video recordings, will be made available to subscribers.

As always, we are working to ensure that the app is a trusted source of information and resources and is consistent with A.A.'s Twelve Traditions and AAWS and GSO policies and practices.

The notification of Regional Trustee vacancies is distributed widely within the A.A. fellowship by the General Service Office (GSO) using available channels of distribution including, but not limited to, use of AAWS' mailing list, publication in *News on the Meeting Guide App*, *What's New* on aa.org, *Box 4-5-9*, and whenever possible, in the next available issues of *Grapevine* and *La Viña* magazines.

Each area in your region may nominate a Regional Trustee candidate, and the suggested procedure for this is outlined in the attached document, "Procedures for Electing Regional Trustee Candidates in the US and Canada."

While a background with business or other professional experience is helpful, the General Service Board (GSB) is also interested in other strengths that Regional Trustees can bring. The GSB wishes to emphasize that A.A. service background and experience are the significant qualifications for Regional Trustee candidates.

Time Commitment

Regional Trustees serve four consecutive one-year terms. Since much is asked of the trustees with respect to their time, please be sure your candidate understands the commitment. Applicants are encouraged to discuss this time commitment with their family and employer. Trustees are reimbursed for travel, hotel, and meal expenses. Trustees are expected to attend the following:

- Three quarterly board weekends - meetings typically run from Friday through Monday noon.
- A fourth quarterly meeting combined with the annual General Service Conference (seven days) in April/May.
- Special meetings of the board when needed.
- Trustees serve on committees of the GSB and may also serve on trustees' subcommittees involving multiple video conference calls, including weekends, weekdays, and evenings.
- Rotational attendance at Regional Forums.
- May be asked to serve two years on either the A.A. World Services, Inc. or AA Grapevine

corporate boards, which meet more frequently than the GSB and include possible corporate board subcommittees.

- Frequently invited to participate in regional or area activities such as service conferences, area assemblies and other A.A. events.

Prior GSCs' have recommended that no area submit the same person as candidate for both Regional Trustee and Trustee-at-Large/US or Canada at the same GSC. Also, a GSC delegate is not eligible as a trustee candidate until one year after their last GSC. Panel 75 delegates will not be eligible for a trustee position at the 77th GSC.

As soon as possible after your area has elected a candidate for Regional Trustee, the GSC delegate is asked to send the name and contact information of the candidate to the secretary of the trustees' Nominating Committee at nominating@aa.org. The secretary will then forward a resume submission link to the candidate for completion. The candidate will then submit their resume electronically or by mail post marked on or before the January 1, 2027, deadline. Please mail resumes to Attn: Secretary, trustees' Nominating Committee, General Service Office, PO Box 459, Grand Central Station, New York, NY 10163.

Based on the 27th General Service Conference recommendation, any candidate who sends in a resume after the January 1, 2027, deadline will not be eligible for election at the 77th GSC.

Please communicate with applicants to prepare their resume carefully as a 1983 Conference Action recommended that all resumes be presented to the trustees' Nominating Committee and the Conference Committee on Trustees exactly as received, with the exception that spelling and grammatical errors may be corrected by the GSO staff preparing resumes for distribution. Original resumes are retained for reference. Some candidates choose to submit a cover letter and letter of recommendation which are optional.

Three new Class B (alcoholic) Trustees will be elected at the General Service Conference (GSC) in April 2027, two Regional Trustees (Northeast and Southwest) and a Trustee-at-Large/Canada.
